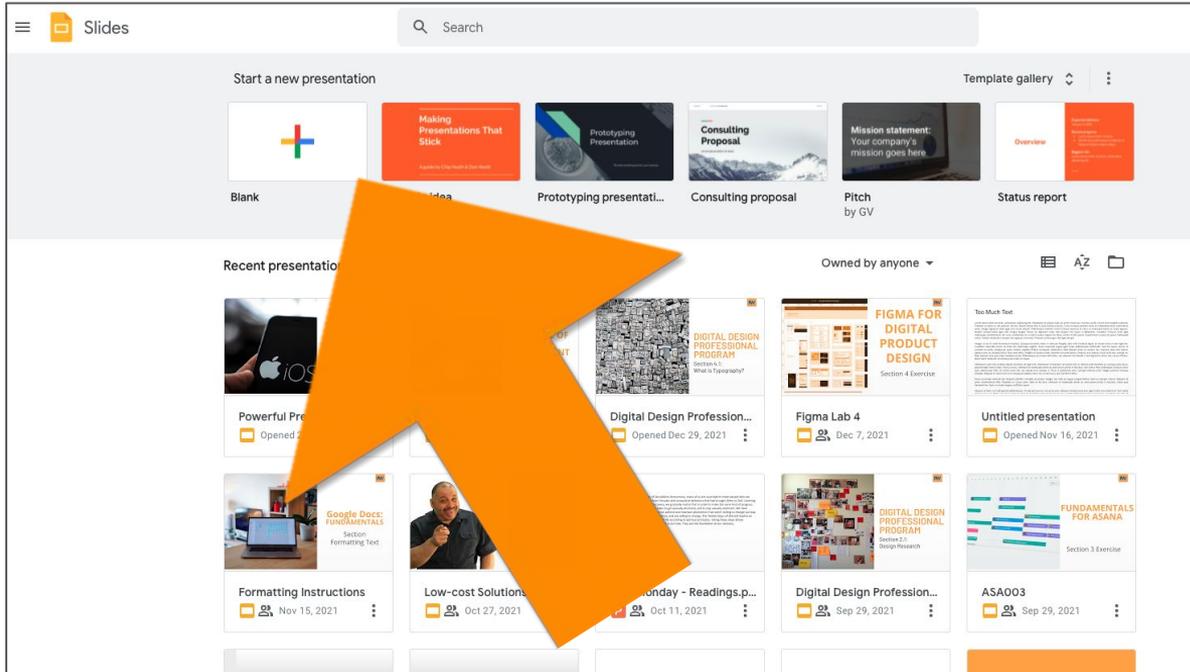


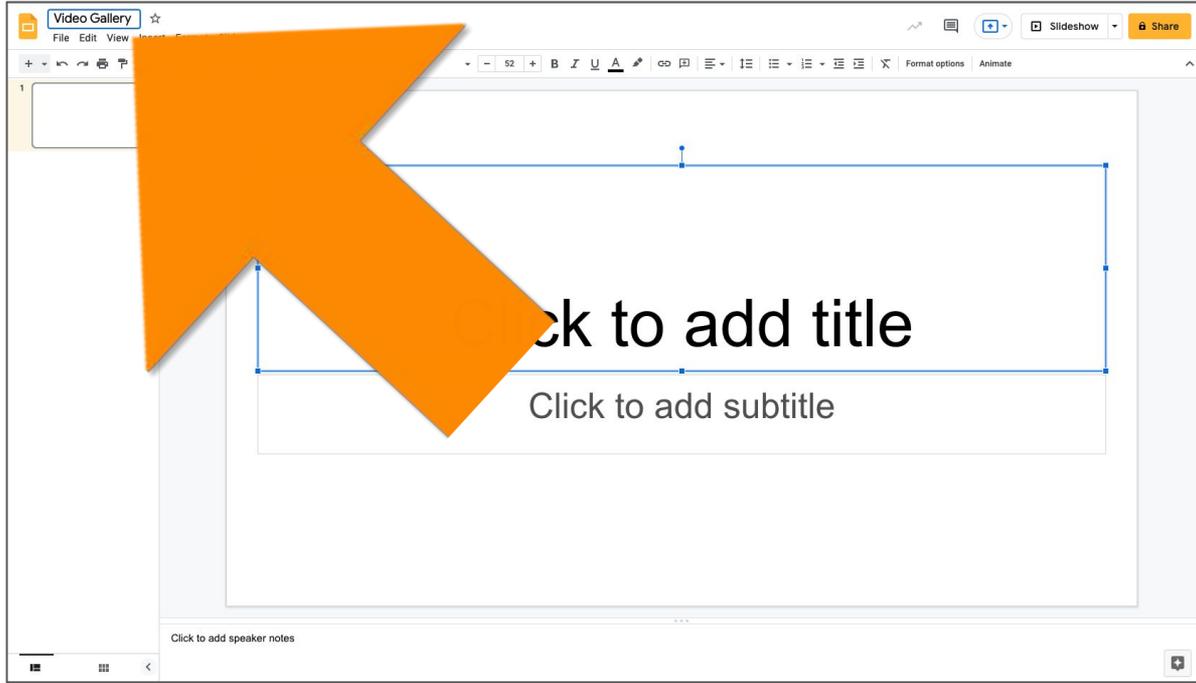
# POWERFUL PRESENTATIONS WITH GOOGLE SLIDES

Section 1 Exercise

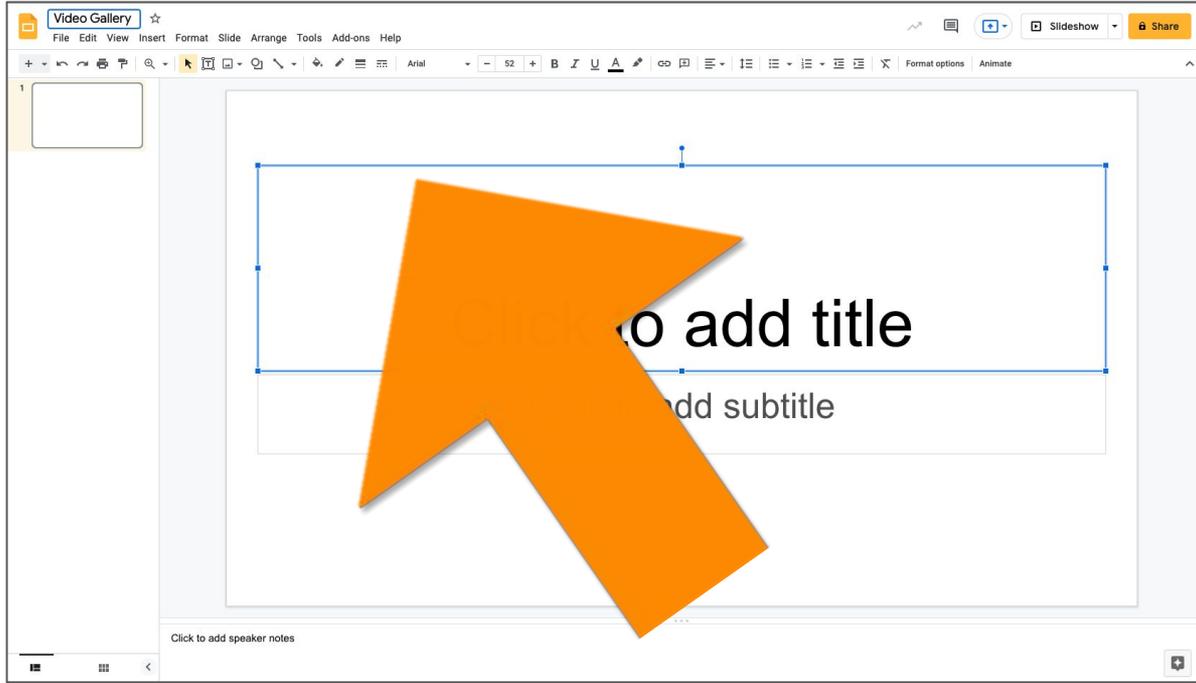


1. Review the video of Mark creating the video gallery using Google Slides.

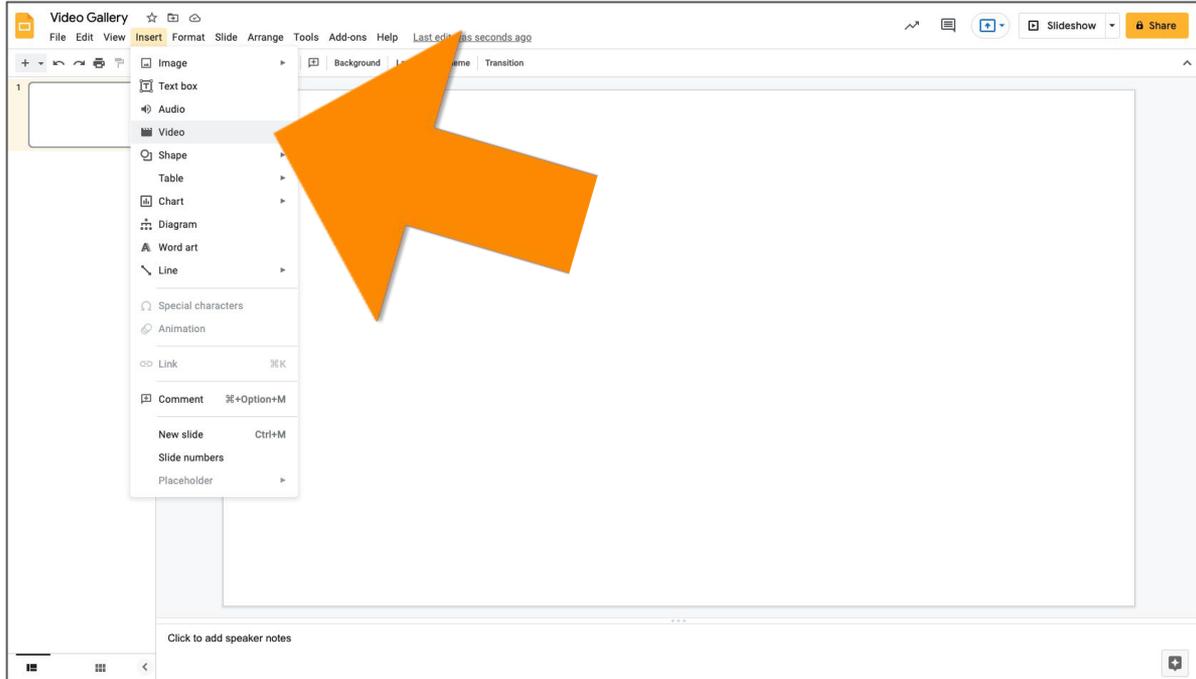
2. Create a blank slide presentation by visiting **slides.google.com** and choosing the option to create a blank presentation.



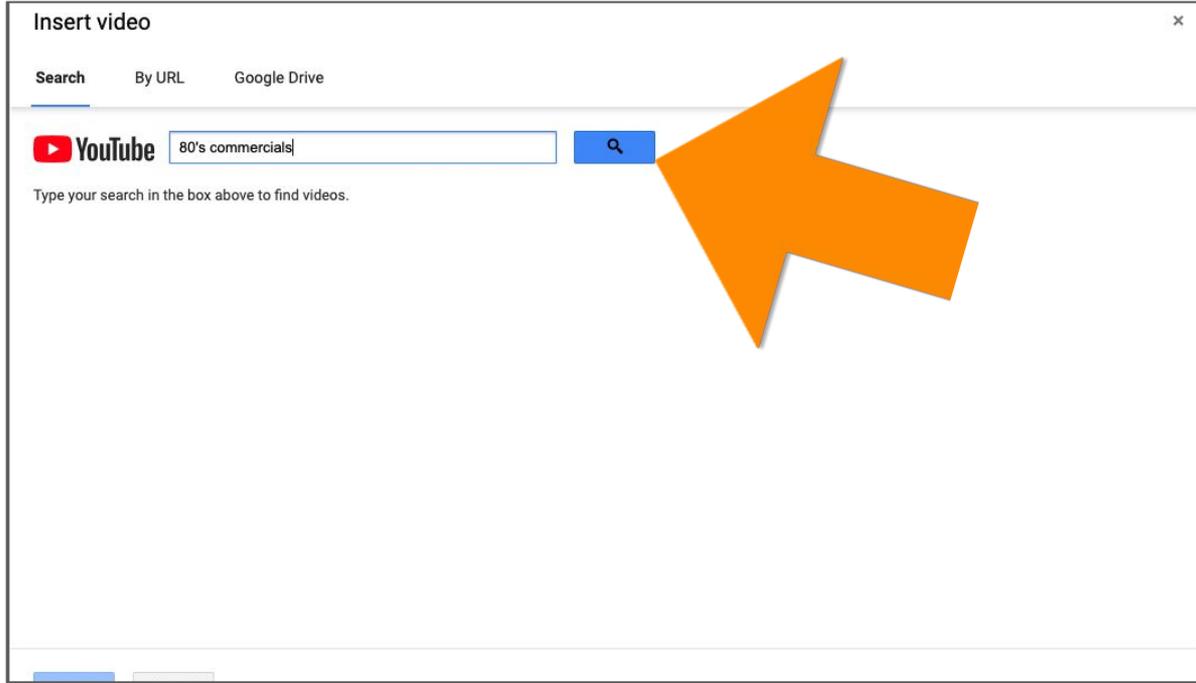
3. Change the name of the project to **Video Gallery** by clicking on the current project name and replacing it.



4. Delete the content on the default slide by clicking on the bounding boxes around the text and pressing the delete key on your keyboard.



5. From the drop-down menus choose **Insert** → **Video**.

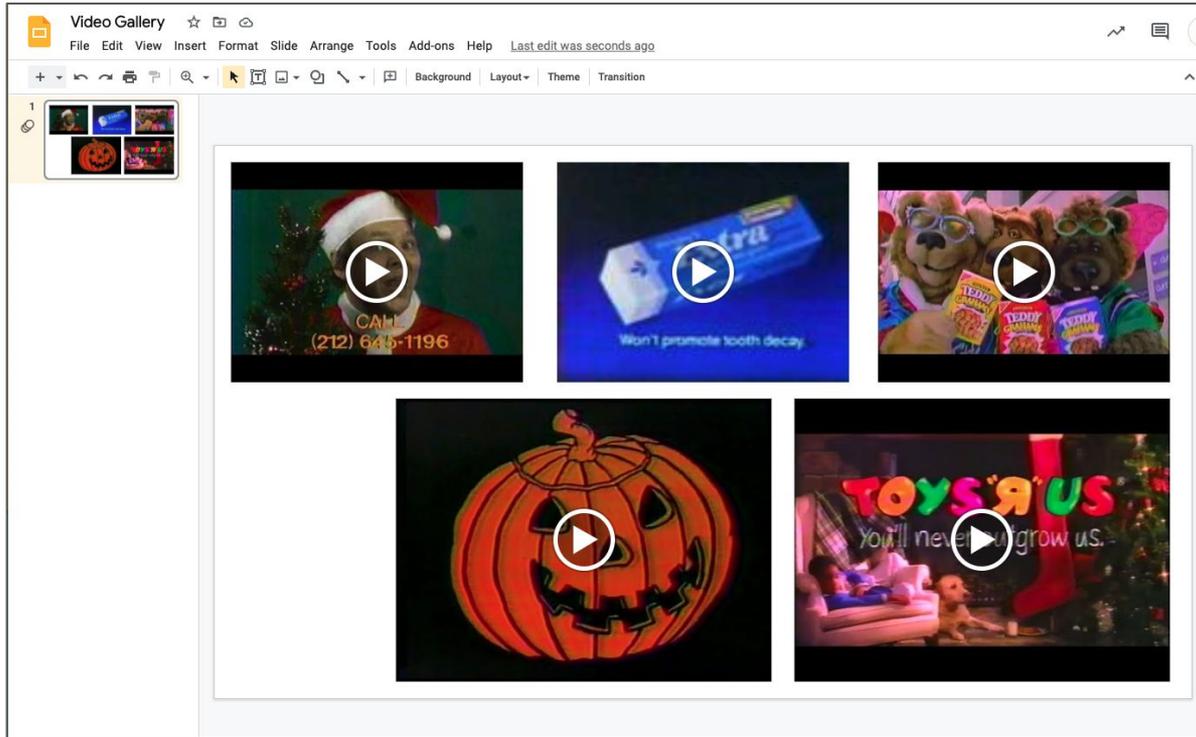


6. Choose the topic for your video gallery and click the search button.
